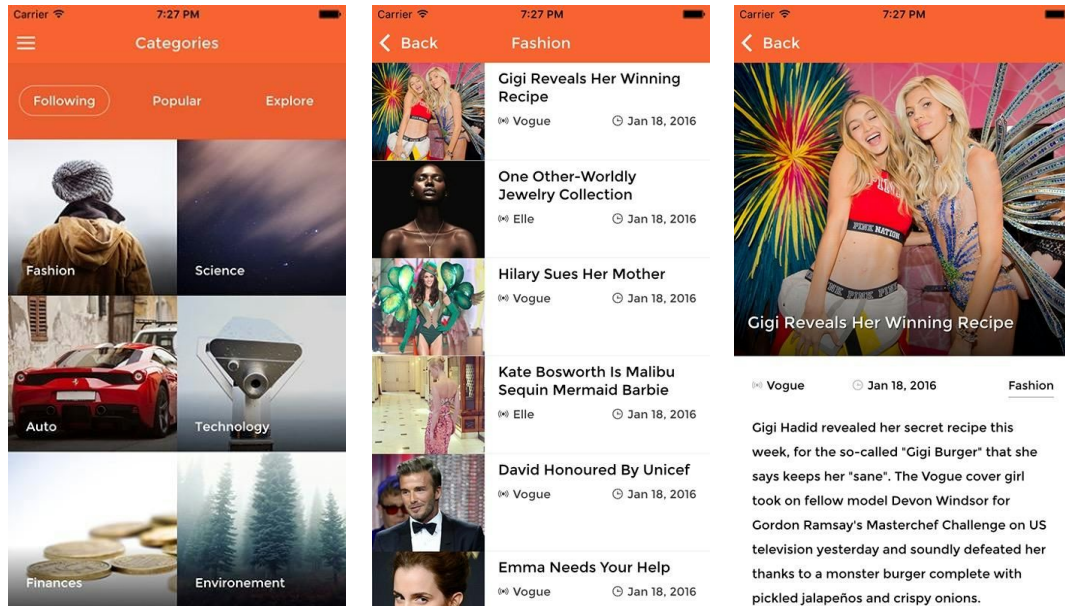


Invision - Ionic Theme

TRY BEFORE YOU BUY

Download the **APK** from [here](#) for Android based devices.

If you don't want to download it or you are using iOS device, use the great **Ionic View** app provided by Ionic Team.

1. Download [Ionic View app](#).
2. Open the app on your phone.
3. Enter the following APP ID: **35ABBD18**

ADVANTAGES OF USING IONIC

- One source for all the supported platforms (mainly Android and OSX).
- Main development in HTML, CSS and JS, which almost all web developers know.
- Built On Angular
- Integration with Cordova and PhoneGap
- Easy to style and change layout using inbuilt SCSS

INSTALLATION

- First you should have Ionic Framework installed on your computer. Detailed steps can be found here: <http://ionicframework.com/getting-started/>
- Open Terminal App on your Mac or Windows Command Line (CMD) on you windows machine
- Choose where to start your project and run the following command:

```
$ ionic start myApp blank
```

(myApp is the name of your app and can be changed to anything you want)

- Browse to the newly created folder:

```
$ cd myApp
```

- Unzip the content of the downloaded ZIP file to this folder using your favourite ZIP program and override the files and folders when prompted.
- Run the following command to setup SASS:

```
$ ionic setup sass
```

- Run the following command to view the theme:

```
$ ionic serve
```

PUSH NOTIFICATIONS

- First you should register to <https://onesignal.com/>
- Create a new Application there and follow the Documentation guides for Ionic projects: <https://documentation.onesignal.com/docs/phonegap-sdk-installation>
- Don't forget to install OneSignal Cordova plugin in your app folder

```
$ cordova plugin add onesignal-cordova-plugin
```

- Edit `www/js/app.js` with your custom OneSignal App settings:

```
var notificationOpenedCallback = function() {};  
// Update with your OneSignal AppId and googleProjectNumber before  
running.  
if ($window.plugins && $window.plugins.OneSignal) {  
  
  $window.plugins.OneSignal.init('bff790de-6c7b-4550-9202-0acebb924b28',  
    {googleProjectNumber: '295165547597'}, notificationOpenedCallback);  
  
}
```

- Update the 3 init parameters
 - Replace `bff790de-6c7b-4550-9202-0acebb924b28` with your OneSignal AppId.
 - Replace `295165547597` with your Google Project Number.
 - (If your app isn't for Android you can replace the number with a blank string).
 - Change the code in the `notificationOpenedCallback` function to your liking.
 - The function is called when you tap on a notification
 - Callback is option if you only want the app to open when a notification is tapped on.

SOCIAL SHARING MODULE

Our Social Sharing module enables social sharing features in your Ionic Framework based app.

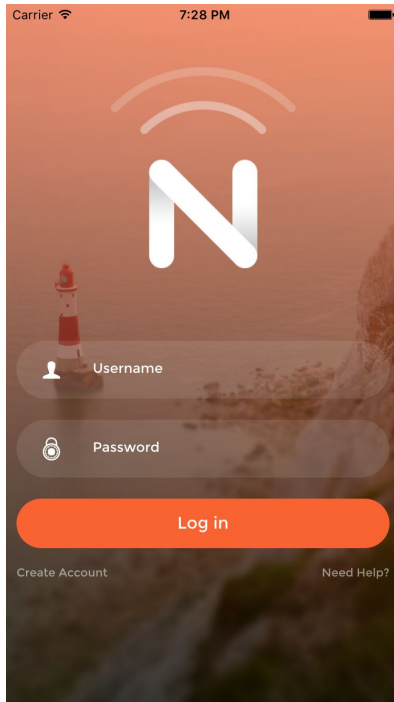
The module is based on the famous social sharing [Cordova Plugin](#). It enables you to share images, text or links. It could be bought separately from our site here:

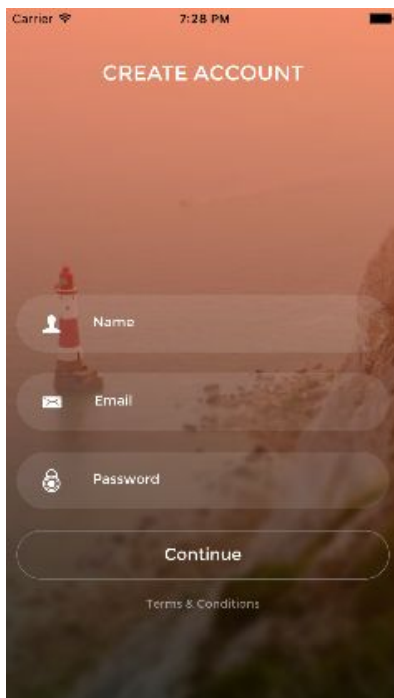


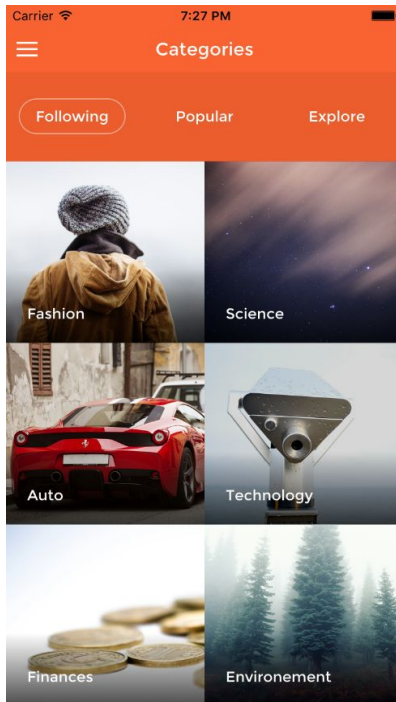
LOGIN / REGISTER

Note: there is no backend form processing attached to the login, it's just visual.

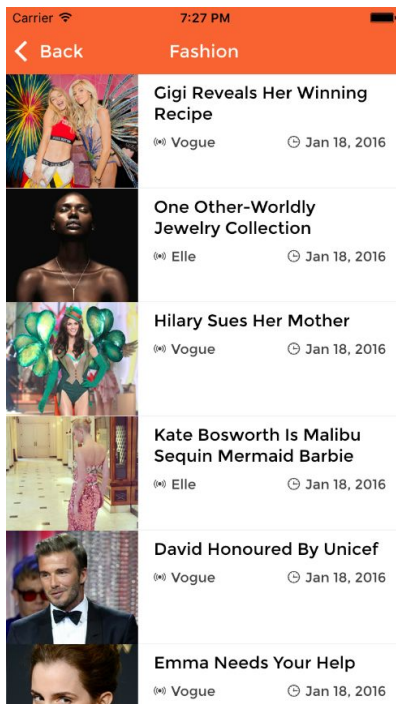




CATEGORIES

Features:

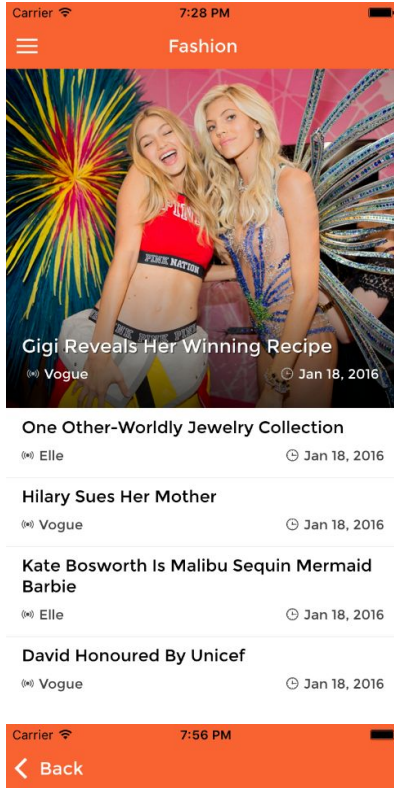
- Tabs with different sorting options

Features:

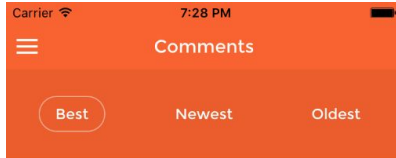
- List all items in category

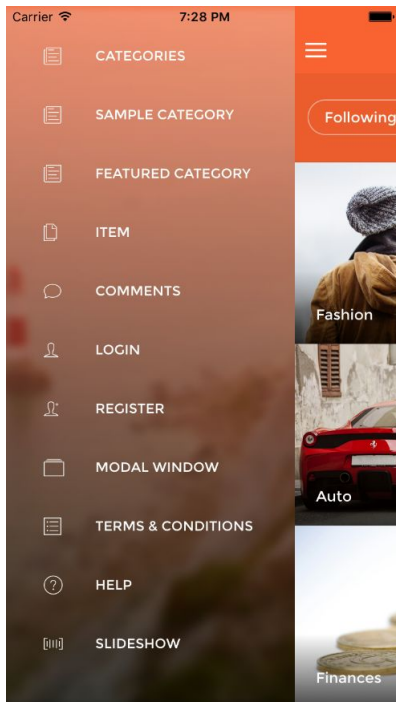

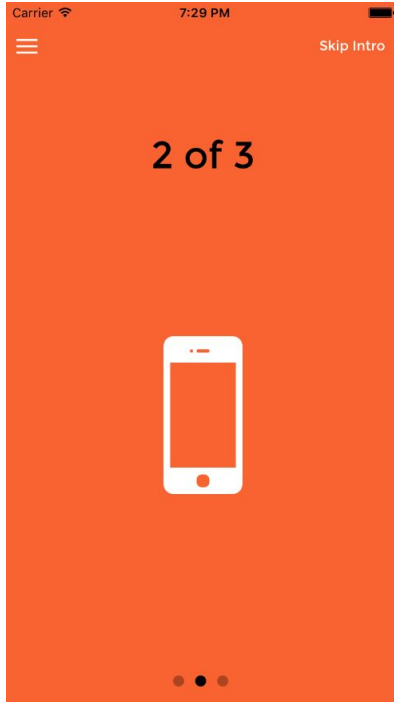

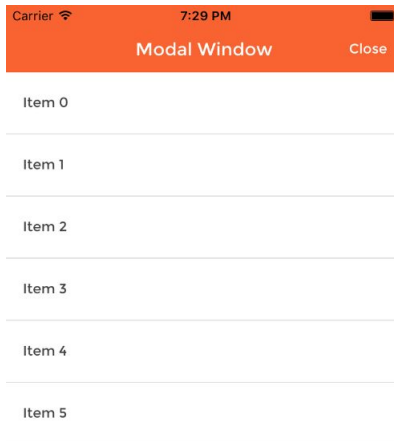
- Background image

Features:

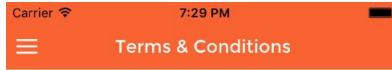
- Could be started on app open or from a menu

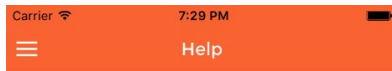

FILES STRUCTURE OF THE THEME

Ionic apps are built with Cordova. Cordova is a means of packaging html/css/js into apps that can run on mobile and desktop devices and provides a plugin architecture for accessing native functionality beyond the reach of JS run from a web browser. As such, Ionic apps have the Cordova file structure.

Once you download the project, you will find the following files structure:

- **resources** - there are two files in this folder:
 - **icon.psd**
 - **splash.psd**

These files are used for Ionic to be able to create icon and splashscreen images for your application. The PSD files are fully editable and you can use them as starting point. For more info check:

- **scss:** is for your app's SASS file.
 - **ionic.app.scss:** is the root file. It contains all links to the used SASS files in the project.
- **www:** is where your app is developed and where you'll spend most of your time when building an Ionic app.
 - **css:** contains either your app's specific CSS file, or your SCSS generated output file, should you use it, along with any other CSS files you wish to add. CSS is added to your project by a <link> tag in your index.html
 - **img:** images.
 - **js:** all the javascript code such as controllers, directives, routing and services.
 - **lib:** is where Ionic and any other libraries you use can be placed. It follows the Bower formatting, and new libs can be added and updated using Bower.
- **modules:** Here are all the files for our social-sharing module.
 - **templates:** is where your view files go. Your project does have a main index.html file in the WWW directory, but your app likely contains many template views that are added dynamically. Unlike your CSS and JS files, views files do not need to be mentioned in your index.html file. You define them in your `$state` definition, and UI Router and Ionic will take care of the rest, including

pre-loading the template file. These files are Angular templates and are parsed before being added to the DOM.

We organized the view files according to the app components for example: categories.html, comments.html, item.html, login.html etc.
